There are a multitude of ways your Legacy Gift can support the future of the Dulwich Picture Gallery. Below you'll see that no matter how big or small your gift it – it will help in enhancing visitors' experiences and preserving the historic importance of the collection.

You may also consider **remembering a loved one** by donating in their memory. Making a donation in memory of a loved one can be a particularly meaningful way to celebrate their life. We have several ways that allow you to remember them in a special way.

We are able to offer:

- Named benches in our beautiful grounds: £5000
- A tree planted in our peaceful meadow their name: £15 000
- Named Flagstones in our cloister: £25,000

Or You can adopt a painting or contribute its conservation. We would be pleased to talk to you in more detail about this.

Alternatively, through our **Legacy Ladder of Giving** a gift in your will from:

£45 provides soft wrap packing materials to secure a painting has a safe and comfortable journey to a restorer.

£90 allows us to carry out analysis of three paint layer cross-sections on a painting in need of conserving, detecting vital clues for its restoration.

£200 allows a British Sign Language interpreter to engage with our deaf community.

£400 pays for an expert conservator to condition-check 10 works in our Collection, discovering any vital restoration needs.

£500 enables us to work for one day with 30 school children who would not normally be able to visit a gallery, and thus foster critical thinking, creative skills and a love of art.

£1000 enables us to provide three creative workshops for adults with dementia, providing a sensory experience in a welcoming and safe environment.

£2,000 Forget the Batmobile it's all about the Artmobile! £2000 allows socially isolated adults a creative arts experience and the chance to socialise.

£3000 lets us work with 180 school children, fostering critical thinking, creative skills and a love of art for life.

£5,704 maintains our beautiful grounds for a year so that they can be enjoyed by everyone.

£6000 allows us to open our doors after hours with two Free Gallery Lates, creating fun ways to discover our collection and welcome new visitors.

£10,000 pays for a week of hands-on workshops with young people who may never have visited a Gallery before.

£30,000 pays for vital conservation work on one picture in our Collection, bringing it back to life, revealing its secrets and protecting it for future generations.

£250,000 secures an exciting and revelatory exhibition, permitting us to carry on bringing acclaimed displays to our community and audiences to enjoy.
