

Volunteer Role Description: Exhibitions Volunteers

We are looking for exhibitions volunteers to support our temporary exhibitions programme. This programme covers three temporary exhibitions per year, as well as a number of smaller scale installations. Our exhibitions span a wide range of genres and periods, from 17th century old masters to modern British printmaking, offering diverse learning opportunities and the chance to engage with some of the world's most respected artworks.

Exhibitions volunteers support our programme through assisting with research, reporting, and other project-based tasks in the exhibitions department, helping us to get the most from our exhibitions. This role will focus primarily on the exhibition *Ribera: The Art of Violence*, with occasional opportunities to support on other exhibition projects.

If you are interested in working in a creative environment, as part of an exhibition team, and with a varied artistic programme, this role is for you!

What you can expect to do in the role:

- Assist on exhibition install/takedown
- Assist on producing exhibition material such as audio/large print guides
- Assist on monitoring and reporting environmental conditions
- Archiving

You don't need to have volunteered with us before, and training will be provided. We're looking for people:

- With an interest and enthusiasm for working within the arts/heritage sector
- Who have good organisational skills
- Who have some writing/proofreading experience
- Who love meeting people and who have a willingness to learn
- Who enjoy working with others in a team
- Who can commit to their volunteer shift

What you'll get:

- An opportunity to work alongside expert coordinators
- An understanding of how exhibition projects work
- The opportunity to meet new people and have fun
- Up to £10 per day travel expenses.

Commitment:

We are looking for volunteers for a three month placement from July to September who are happy to commit to 1-3 days per week with a minimum of 8 days per month. The volunteer placement will be based at Dulwich Picture Gallery.

Training:

A half-day training and induction will cover all necessary information relating to the role.

On-going training, support and supervision will be provided throughout your volunteering experience.
